Assembling our Alpha Rho Family History! By Denise Sabo Brenner, AP '97

In anticipation of the 25th anniversary of Delta Zeta's recolonization at Ohio Wesleyan, we are attempting to map 25 years' worth of Alpha Rho family trees. Visit our online Google Document at http://tinyurl.com/apfamilytrees to identify your family and see our progress to date! The family trees we have so far are in the worksheet titled "Roster with Littles."

Sisters initiated in 1994 or earlier: we REALLY need your assistance. Check both the "Roster with Littles" and the "Both Big and Little Unknown" worksheets for your name. There are quite a few sisters we have NO family information for.

If you don't see your name in either of the worksheets above, it's likely because you are not appearing on the official roster we obtained from Headquarters (if this is an error, contact me at dmsabo@hotmail.com and I will work with you and Headquarters to correct the situation). However, you may be listed in the "Sisters in composites but not in trees" worksheet – check for your name and let us know where you fit in the trees!

After taking a look at the Google Doc, email, Facebook message, or text your family tree additions, corrections and/or changes to me at dmsabo@hotmail.com or 614-506-5509. This could include filling in the blanks for big/little sisters, providing married names for those listed only by maiden name, or informing us of sisters that are missing from the list.

Most importantly - no matter how trivial you think your information is, every little bit is helping to assemble the trees! So be sure to contact me.

And keep checking back with the Google Doc at http://tinyurl.com/apfamilytrees for additions/changes - I'm updating it continuously as information comes in. Thanks to all of you who have contributed so far; we're making great progress. We hope to have all our sisters connected to the trees by our 25th anniversary reunion celebration in October, 2014, where a special family tree surprise will await all our guests!
